

flower blossom tutorial

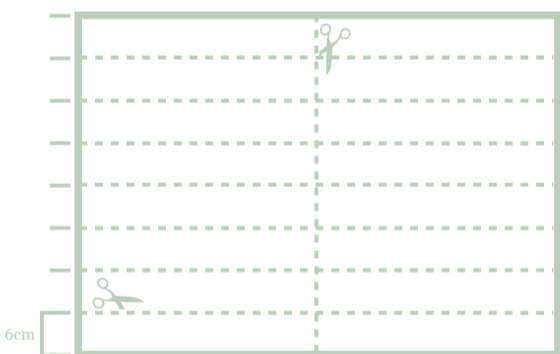


ingredients (makes 16 blossoms)

♥ 1 sheet of mae wrapping paper ♥ pencil ♥ scissors ♥ ruler ♥ stapler ♥ hole puncher ♥ twine (optional)

method

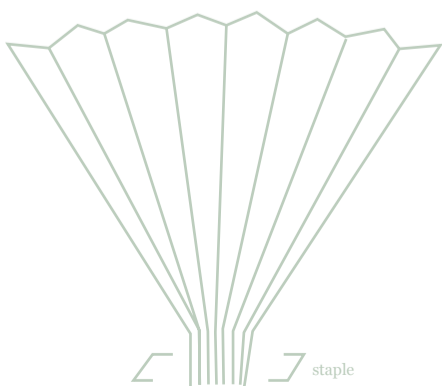
1. Place the sheet of paper pattern side down.
2. Divide and mark the shortest side of the paper evenly into 8 sections of 6cm with a pencil. (If you want smaller blossoms decrease the width of each section. If you want bigger blossoms increase the width of each section and use the whole length of paper).
3. Cut these sections into strips then cut the strips in half. For pretty edges use crafters paper edge scissors. We like the 'Mini-Pinking' styled edging.



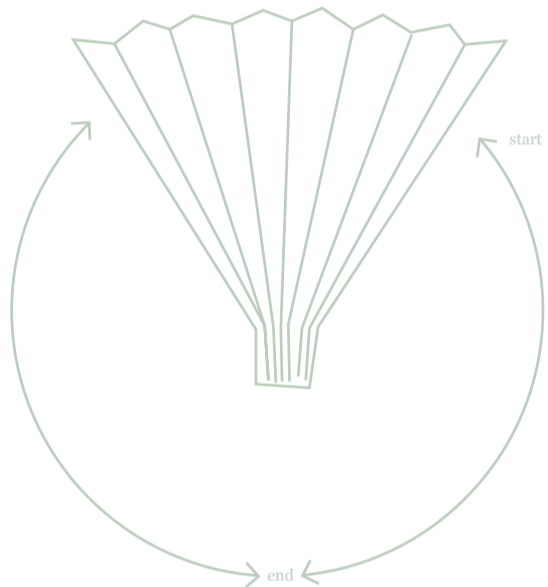
3. Fold each strip of paper like an accordion with a 1.5cm gap between each fold.
4. Once folded your section should now look something like this.



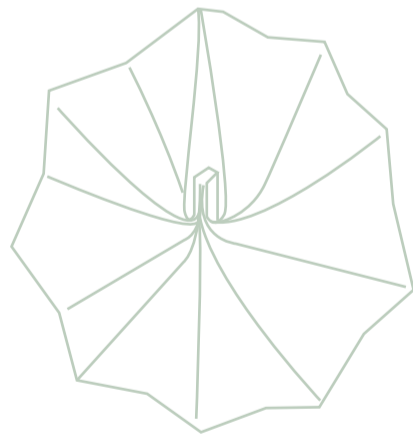
5. Hold the folds together and staple each side of the bottom so that it resembles the shape of a fan.



6. Take the opposite edges and make them meet while opening up the fan.



7. Staple the ends together at the back so you are left with a seamless zig-zag fold that looks like this.



8. Punch a hole at the top in the back of the blossom so twine or ribbon can be threaded through.

9. Use as garland or present toppers.
